Dear Montville Township Friends and Fellow Citizens,

We would like to wish you a happy and joyous holiday season!

As we draw near to the end of this year we would like to reflect on what has been a difficult period, particularly on the financial front. Knowing the poor economy impacted our taxpayers, we sharpened the pencil and delivered a Municipal budget increase of 3.5%. While significant portions of our budget are fixed we nonetheless cut spending and found places to save; unfortunately those cuts impacted some of our Township employees and certain niceties to which we were accustomed (like subsidized food at Montville Day). We recognize 2010 will be a difficult year as well and will work diligently toward further spending reductions and savings.

We had to 'do the right thing' and cover higher operating and financing costs of our water and sewer operations with a rate increase. Significant capital projects, higher costs from contracted vendors and lower new connection revenues caused the rate increases. In the review process we developed rates that were based on usage and, therefore, more fair to all ratepayers.

On a positive note we were successful in obtaining county grants for Open Space purchases (\$1.8 million) and road repaving. We have now received over \$4 million of Open Space grants in the last 2 years! We initiated a Master Plan review for appropriate zoning and performed a thorough review of the impacts of the Highlands Act – both of which are important to maintaining our environmental protections (particularly for our aquifer) and the aesthetics of Montville, Pine Brook and Towaco. And on the celebratory side we had tremendously successful Fourth of July and Montville Day events.

And we would be remiss if we didn't thank all our wonderful volunteers who give of their time to serve our citizens and make our township a better place live and to raise our children.

We hope 2009 was a good year for you and your family. We look forward to an even better 2010.

## TOWNSHIP'S RECYCLING COORDINATOR RECEIVES RECYCLING AWARD

Adam Brewer, Montville Township's Management Specialist and Recycling Coordinator, was awarded the "Brewer's a Doer!" Award by the Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority at their 22nd Annual Recycling Awards Dinner.

Mr. Brewer was honored for his exceptional work as Montville Township's Recycling Coordinator. He recently completed the New Jersey Recycling Certification Series and is a Certified Recycling Professional. In addition to working with the schools to ensure that they are recycling properly, he promotes the use of ClearStream trash and recycling containers at public events, and he institutes proper enforcement procedures throughout the Township.

Mr. Brewer was also presented with a proclamation in recognition of his achievements by the Montville Township Committee at their meeting of November 10th. At this meeting, Frank Bastone, Township Administrator, reported to the Township Committee that due to Mr. Brewer's efforts and attention to detail, the Township's Recycling Tonnage Grant has increased significantly.

The Montville Township Health Department, in conjunction with the Women's Club of Montville Township and the North Jersey Blood Center, will be sponsoring their 35th annual blood drive on Sunday, January 24, 2010 from 10:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. to be held at the Montville Township First Aid Squad Building, located at 137 Changebridge Road, Montville.

Any resident, 17-75 years of age, weighing at least 110 pounds, who has not donated blood for at least eight (8) weeks is capable of offering a blood donation. Persons 17 years of age must have parental consent and individuals between the ages of 66 and 75 must have had a complete physical by their physician and submit a signed, dated certification of such an examination. Although no fasting is necessary before the donation, cream, butter, fried food and alcohol should be avoided.

Blood reserves are available to any resident in need of this resource as long as the supplies last. 

**CHAMBER CALLS FOR NOMINEES FOR ANNUAL AWARDS**

**ANNUAL AWARDS CRITERIA**

**Business/Business Person of the Year**

This award seeks to recognize a business or business person who has operated a respected business in Montville for at least five (5) years. The business should be recognized for outstanding practices, products and/or services. Involvement in the community by way of contributions to local programs, events and other service to the township and township organizations beyond business practices will be consider a plus.

**Citizen of the Year**

This award recognizes an outstanding, well-rounded citizen who lives or works in Montville and has demonstrated exemplary service by way of volunteerism and community involvement.

**Beautification Award**

This award is to recognize a business, property owner or organization which has made significant improvements to a site within Montville Township that enhances the appearance and general look of the property.

**Organization of the Year**

This award is to recognize an organization which has consistently performed services within the township for at least five (5) years, and has achieved or carried out one or more outstanding events or projects during the previous year.

**Public Safety Award**

This award recognizes public safety officials, including Police, Fire and First Aid, who have a minimum of five (5) years service to the township and have been involved in and contributed to an act (or acts) of exemplary service while providing for the safety of the community and its citizens.

**Public Service Award**

This award seeks to recognize any public employee of the township and the Board of Education with at least five (5) years service who has made significant contributions to the township or school system above and beyond the activities and responsibilities of their present job.

**Silver Service Award**

This award is to recognize a private citizen or public servant who has served at least 25 years in Montville Township in multiple volunteer organizations and/or on township boards or committees. This person has demonstrated a long time dedication and devotion to the community.

### Transfer GI Bill Benefits to Family

A popular feature of the new Post 9/11 GI Bill is one military families have long sought: the ability for an eligible veteran to transfer the benefits to his or her immediate family members. Any GI who was serving on active duty or in the Selected Reserve on or after Aug. 1, 2009, and is eligible for the Post 9/11 GI Bill can transfer benefits;

- to a spouse after six years of service and agreeing to serve an additional four years.
- to a child after 10 years of service.

More than 30,000 service members applied to share their GI bill with family members in the first five weeks when it became available.





## SIGHTED LEARN TO ASSIST THE BLIND, RESPECTFULLY

(Montville, NJ)-- The scene was a bit comical-- a dozen or so employees and their bosses, wearing blindfolds and being led around by sighted people in an activity room at the Chelsea assisted living residence on Changebridge Road. But the lesson was serious-- how to help someone who is visually impaired by offering to be a human guide.

"You offer your arm," said David Feinhals of the New Jersey Foundation for the Blind. "Don't grab them. Ask if they'd like help."

It's all in the approach, explained Feinhals, one of two trainers leading the session aimed at teaching Chelsea care givers how to assist the visually impaired. With 3.5% of the over-65 population in America legally blind, the Chelsea gets its share of residents who are visually impaired. This training for the Chelsea's care-giving staff was designed to help them be more sensitive and helpful to those residents.

"A new resident who is visually impaired is used to their home and has to adapt to life here," said Lorraine Azarcon, Health Services Director of the Chelsea. "We have to show them where the furniture is, where the walls are and so on."

Certified medication aides got a taste of what it's like having cataracts by wearing goggles that were fogged over, or goggles with no peripheral vision simulating glaucoma. But the coup de gras was when they donned blindfolds and took turns being led around by a guide, a humbling exercise in trust, and then being a guide.

"You really can feel what it's like to put yourself totally in someone else's hands," remarked Kevin Seidel, Executive Director of the Chelsea. "This training really brings home the need for all of us to be more sensitive to those with visual impairments and to learn how to actually be helpful if they want help."

The NJ Foundation for the Blind, which provided the training, is a non-profit organization that empowers blind or visually impaired adults to be as independent as possible. They can be reached at 973-627-0055.



SECTION 1 THURSDAY, DECEMBER 31

SECTION II FRIDAY DECEMBER 18.

The Vegetative Waste Program will begin again on APRIL 1, 2010.

Brush must be tied so that one person can handle each bundle, with the maximum bundle size being:

2 FEET IN DIAMETER, 4 FEET IN LENGTH, 50 POUNDS IN WEIGHT.

Individual branches may not exceed: 4 INCHES IN DIAMETER  
Grass/leaves may be put into containers or paper, biodegradable bags. Plastic bags cannot be used for any vegetative waste.

Township Code prohibits placing grass, leaves, vegetative waste, or any debris into roadways or drainage facilities, such as creeks, culverts, ditches, drains or drainage structures, gutters, pipes, streams or swales.

12.16.10 All snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of snowfall or accumulation. If the ice is so frozen it may be thoroughly covered with sand.\*

10.08.60 Whenever snow has fallen and the road is covered, no vehicle shall be parked on either side of any roadway. This remains in effect until the roads have been plowed sufficiently.\*

## DOG LICENSES DUE IN JANUARY

Montville Township dog owners are reminded that their pet's annual dog license is due for renewal during January 2010. As a convenience, computerized dog license renewal forms will be sent to registered dog owners of the Township in late December. Completed forms should be returned to the health department with any updated rabies certificates and the proper fee:

**\$15.00** for altered dogs and **\$20.00** for un-spayed or un-neutered dogs. Dog licenses received or postmarked after January 31, 2010 will be subject to an additional

**\$5.00** late fee during February plus **\$1.00** for each month thereafter.

If any Montville Township resident does not receive a dog license renewal form, they may be obtained from the health department offices or by logging onto the Township website at [www.montvilleni.org](http://www.montvilleni.org). Not receiving a license application in the mail will not waive licensing or late fee requirements since it is the owner's responsibility to ensure their pets are properly licensed during the month of January.

The purpose of the dog licensing program is rabies control and is mandated by the State. A dog census throughout the town will be initiated in February to identify unlicensed dogs which, if found, would subject the owners to a summons in addition to the licensing and late fees. To be eligible for the 2010 dog license, the rabies expiration date must be November 1, 2010 or later.


