

Dear Residents and Businesses of Montville Township:

Currently, our society is extremely focused on creating a "Green" environment; protecting our planet and all of its natural resources. Long before we became aware of all the aspects of "Going Green," we became focused on improving water quality and controlling stormwater pollution.

Water from rain and melting snow that flows over lawns, parking lots and streets is known as stormwater runoff. This water, which travels along gutters, into catch basins and through storm drain pipes and ditches, usually is not treated, but then flows or is discharged into local water bodies. Along the way, the stormwater picks up trash (fast food wrappers, cigarette butts, styrofoam cups, etc.) and toxins and other pollutants (gas, motor oil, antifreeze, fertilizers, pesticides and pet droppings). This polluted water can kill fish and other wildlife, destroy wildlife habitat, contaminate drinking water sources and force the closing of beaches because of health threats to swimmers.

Human activity is largely responsible for the stormwater pollution. Everything that we put on the ground or into the storm drain can end up in our water. Whether we have clean water is up to all of us.

In this regard, the Montville Township Committee has enacted legislation to control the pollutants listed above, which can be viewed by visiting the Stormwater Management Page, listed under the Engineering Department on the Montville Township Website at www.montvillenj.org. All township residents and business should be aware of these codes.

The Township Committee asks every Montville Township resident and business to do their part in helping to keep our water clean and our township Green.

MONTVILLE TOWNSHIP MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Planning Board unanimously adopted the Route 202 Corridor Study of the Master Plan on April 22nd. That comprehensive review extends from the Boonton Town line eastward to the previous Towaco Center zone adopted a few years ago. The remaining segment of Route 202 east of the train station to Lincoln Park will be completed next along with the balance of the Land Use component of the Master Plan.

The Housing Element was also finalized by the Planning Board and Township Committee. Following a thorough analysis of the vacant land inventory, environmental constraints and Highlands restrictions, Montville continues to have met its affordable housing obligations for new units through prior-built units, approved developments, and current zoning. No new affordable housing zoning is anticipated under the current plan.

As the rest of the Master Plan is finalized this summer and fall, public meetings will continue to be held. Information concerning the Plan is constantly updated on the Township website at www.montvillenj.org. The Master Plan Subcommittee is comprised of Gary Lewis, Chair, Ladis Karkowsky, Russ Lipari, John Visco, Township Committeewoman Deb Neilson, and is staffed by Linda White along with Joseph Burgis, Town Planner.

MONTVILLE DOG PARK GOES HI-TECH

As of April 1, 2010, a new secured lock system for entry to the dog park was implemented. When you register your dog at Montville Dog Park (residents - \$20; and non-residents - \$25), there is a one-time fee of \$10 for a key fob for entrance to the park. This ensures licensed, neutered, responsible members only. Already the benefits are apparent with the park being much cleaner and safer, since the implementation. Members can feel at ease knowing the dogs have been fecal tested, licensed, etc. and have a general idea of what dogs are around them. (Dee Cook's idea of the entry system was successfully implemented by Pete Borboroglu – thanks for the great job Pete).

The Montville Dog Park is and has always been self sustained by membership dues, donations, and other fund raising means. (No tax dollars support the park). And once again the fund raising dinner at the Red Barn Restaurant was greatly appreciated – 10% of the sales were donated to the park. Thanks again Red Barn and supporters.

Also, thanks to Todd Wolf, from Companion Animal Hospital, for the very informative Pet Safety and Health Seminar held on April 26, 2010.

Dear Organization Leader,

We recently opened a Food Pantry to serve the residents, our neighbors, of Montville Township. So far we've received great support from the community and confirmation that such a Pantry is needed to serve some of our families that are going through a 'tough time'. Now we need your help. While donations of food and money are always needed and welcome — what we really need is you.

In order for this pantry to succeed we need the support of the various groups and organizations in town in the form of manpower. Here is what we need: a commitment from you to supply people to run the pantry on a specific day each month. For example, we need you to organize within your group to supply at least 2 people to cover a shift. A shift is 4 hours and is either on a Thursday from 3:00 pm – 7:00 pm or on Saturday from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm. It need not be the same 2 people for all 4 hours but rather that at least 2 people are there at all times during your once a month (every month) shift of 4 hours.

The reason we must have your help is twofold; first, we need the help, there are not enough of us to do this job; second, but more importantly, we need the support of the people of Montville for this important work. 





In Montville Township the Henry Doremus House, at 490 Rt 202, and the Nicholas Vreeland Out Kitchen, at 52 Jacksonville Road, will be open September 18 (Saturday) from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm and September 19 (Sunday) from 12:00 noon – 4:00 pm for the “The Pathways Of History Museum Tour”. In addition, the Historical Societies of Boonton, Boonton Township, Kinnelon, and Butler will also participate in the tour by opening their museum doors, and those of historic homes in their towns, to the public. Donations of canned items or cash contributions for the Montville Township Food Pantry will be accepted as admission for the tour.

“Following the Pathways of History – Links to Each Other and to the Past” museum tour will present history in multiple forms. A glimpse of life in Montville Township at the historically rare Henry Doremus House will recall when George Washington actually did sleep there; how a “out” kitchen was used in colonial times; and how the early residents of Boonton came from England to work in the Boonton Iron Works, which will be discussed in a walking tour of Boonton’s historic residential area. At the Miller-Kingsland House in Boonton, visitors can see a home built in 1740 which has been in the keeping of only three families up until the present time. Other highlights include the Oscar A. Kincaid Home of History in Boonton Township, the Butler Railroad Museum, the Kinnelon Museum, a farmer’s market, costumed hosts, musical performances, and a demonstration of wool weaving.

PATHWAYS FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN

“INCLUDE ME!” EVENTS

The Lead Mentors of Pathways, a group of young adults ages 12-18 dedicated to bringing about social change, decided to set a goal to make New Jersey a leader in the inclusion of children with special needs in their schools and their communities. This is no small task, considering New Jersey’s 10% out-of-district school placement rate, the highest in the nation, for students with disabilities, while most other states are at 3% or below. The students are transported every day to and from private schools, attending classes in a segregated setting with other students with disabilities. Inclusion may not mean much to most people, but to families of children with special needs, whose children are often segregated, bullied, and isolated without friends, finding opportunities for authentic inclusion is vital. Montville Township is fortunate to have many after-school activities for these children and mentors who are trained to actively help out and be friends to them. In other towns in New Jersey, this is far from the case.

Despite the daunting task to improve inclusion, the Lead Mentors began this year to lead a movement with an “Include ME” theme that had its opening day on May 21st with “Paint the Town Yellow,” when students and school district staff throughout Montville Township, Morris Plains, Morristown, and Cranford showed support by purchasing and wearing yellow “Include ME!” t-shirts. Businesses, including GlaxoSmithKline and AlphaGraphics in Parsippany, Model A Fitness in Boonton, Verizon Wireless in Denville, The Chelsea at Montville and Dimaira Periodontal in Montville, AXA in Jersey City, and many others supported the effort by purchasing and wearing the shirts. The Lead Mentors sold over 1,000 “Include ME!” shirts in Montville Township alone, and received over 100 shirt orders from people outside of New Jersey as far away as Puerto Rico. This incredible support is indeed a statement that has not simply helped the Lead Mentors to spread the word, but has actually brought the importance of inclusion for people with disabilities right into the forefront.

Our “Include ME!” Walkathon took place the next day on May 22nd with over 260 people in attendance. Thank you to all who participated and made this our largest event yet. The “Include ME!” 5K Race is coming up on June 26, 2010, the start of Montville Township’s Fourth of July festivities at the Montville Township Public Library. MONTVILLE RESIDENTS WALK ALL NIGHT AT AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY RELAY FOR LIFE

More than 600 Came Out to Help Create a World with Less Cancer and More Birthdays

Montville residents were up all night again—but no one seemed to mind since it was for the 2010 American Cancer Society Relay For Life. They joined a national movement that, since inception in 1985, has raised more than \$3 billion to create a world with less cancer and more birthdays.

At sundown, hundreds of candles were lit in an emotional luminaria ceremony and all participants walked a silent lap in remembrance and in honor of those struck by cancer.

“When you see all those lights flickering in the darkness, and knowing that each one glows for a certain person, it really makes you realize that we all know someone who has battled this disease,” says Sylvan Dalia, a cancer survivor herself, and event co-chair. “She adds, it makes all the hard work and effort worth it to know that in our own way, we’re making a difference.”

“We are so appreciative of the overwhelming show of support from the residents and businesses of this community,” says Sylvana. Special thanks are extended to the Montville Township Committee, MTHS staff and administration, the Police Explorers Club, the Kiwanis Club, and the 2010 Relay coordinating committee. Thank you’s are also extended to DJ’s at Large, Valhalla Band, Jessica Rose, Ken & Regina Smoler for entertainment. Bart’s Foods, “Donations in Memory of Debbie Lacy,” The Columbia Inn, the Montville Inn, Gen-carelli’s, the Red Barn, and the Restaurant Depot all generously supported and fed the relay participants.

“We are especially grateful to the many volunteers and their families for all of their hard work to make Relay For Life a reality. They represent hope that those lost to cancer will not be forgotten, that those who face cancer will continue to celebrate many more birthdays, and that the disease will one day be eliminated,” says Debbie Hasbrouck.



Grass / leaves may be put into containers or paper biodegradable bags.

Plastic bags cannot be used for any vegetative waste.

Township Code prohibits placing grass, leaves, vegetative waste, or any debris into roadways or drainage facilities such as ditches, streams, creeks, culverts, drains, pipes, swales, gutters and drainage structures.
