

Welcome to the Fall-Winter edition of the Montville Messenger. This year Montville Township will be dedicating what was known around town as the Edmunds Barn to former mayor Fred Eckhardt. Fred passed away on Sept. 1, 2009 and served as our mayor for 18 years. Fred was also very involved in athletics and the development of our youth. The Edmunds barn was just that - a barn that came with some land the town purchased that abuts the high school property. Fred had a vision to create a wrestling facility by renovating the barn. As only Fred could, citizens in town with trade skills donated time and materials to fulfill Fred's vision. Many organizations discussed dedicating a facility to honor Fred. The Township Committee and Recreation Commission concluded this site would be the best location to memorialize Fred's legacy and dedication to Montville Township. Please make every effort to attend the dedication at 91 Passaic Valley Road, on Saturday, November 20, at 1 p.m.

Around town you will notice the old municipal building at 86 River Road is getting a face lift. The Montville Fire Department and Board of Education are renovating this building. The building will provide storage and offices for the fire department as well as new offices for the Board of Education.

About the time you receive the Messenger the building at 7 Church Lane, that is adjacent to 86 River Road, will be demolished in preparation for the construction of a new five- town animal shelter. The new shelter will complete the first phase of renovations for the corner of River Road and Church Lane.

The Township Committee also voted to go forward with a reassessment of all properties in town during 2011. Morris County typically requires a town perform a revaluation every ten years. The last revaluation completed in Montville Township was in 1998.

## DOG LICENSES DUE IN JANUARY

Montville Township dog owners are reminded that their pet's annual dog license is due for renewal during January, 2011. As a convenience, computerized dog license renewal forms will be sent to registered dog owners of the Township in late December. These forms should be checked for accuracy, corrected where needed, and returned to the health department, located at 195 Changebridge Road, either by mail or in person. These completed forms must be accompanied by proof of rabies protection and spay/neuter certification or notarization, if applicable, should changes be made to these areas of the computerized forms. Please be sure to include the proper fee when returning the forms: \$15.00 for altered dogs and \$20.00 for un-spayed or un-neutered dogs. Dog licenses received or postmarked after January 31, 2011 will be subject to an additional \$5.00 late fee during February plus \$1.00 for each month thereafter.

If any Montville Township resident does not receive a dog license renewal form or if additional forms are needed, they may be obtained from the health department offices or by logging onto the Township website at [www.montvillenj.org](http://www.montvillenj.org). Not receiving a license application in the mail will not waive licensing or late fee requirements since it is the owner's responsibility to ensure their pets are properly licensed during the month of January.

The purpose of the dog licensing program is rabies control and is mandated by the State. A dog census throughout the town will be initiated in February to identify unlicensed dogs and to gain compliance with local and state licensing requirements. Should unlicensed dogs be found, the owners will be subject to a summons in addition to the licensing and late fees. To be eligible for the 2011 dog license, the rabies expiration date must be November 1, 2011 or later.



## DID YOU NOTICE THE TEAL RIBBONS?

September was Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month and, once again, volunteers in Montville Township joined thousands across New Jersey and other states to "Turn the Towns Teal!" Ribbons were tied throughout our community, largely through the efforts of the St. Pius Youth Ministry and Montville Township High School Key Club, as part of the fourth annual campaign to raise awareness of this leading cause of cancer deaths among women.

Ovarian cancer is known as "The Silent Disease," because the symptoms are often vague and subtle, causing the cancer to go unnoticed and, in many cases, misdiagnosed. As a result, ovarian cancer is often confirmed only later, in its more life-threatening stages, when treatment options and chances of long-term survival are greatly reduced. If ovarian cancer is found before it spreads outside the ovary, 90%-95% of women will survive at least five years. However, only 19% of ovarian cancers are found at this stage. There is presently NO early detection test, so awareness of the symptoms is the most critical factor in fighting this deadly disease.

Ovarian Cancer Whispers....So Listen! Here are some of the warning signs:

- Discomfort in the abdominal/pelvic region
- Swelling of the stomach (abdomen)
- Continuous fatigue
- Unusual weight gain or loss, notably in the abdominal area
- Ongoing gastrointestinal complaints including nausea, indigestion and/or gas
- Frequent urination (in the absence of an infection)
- Pain during intercourse
- Bleeding between periods or after menopause

## PINWHEELS FOR PEACE

In today's world, peace needs to become more than just a word. Cedar Hill Elementary school in Montville Township shares this belief and for the first time this year put words to action. On Tuesday, September 21, 2010 the students, staff, and parents of Cedar Hill joined together in a peaceful march, celebrating Pinwheels for Peace, an International art and literacy project, in honor of the U.N. International Day of Peace. Pinwheels for Peace is an art installation project started in 2005 by two Art teachers, Ann Ayers and Ellen McMillan, of Coconut Creek, Florida, as a way for students to express their feelings about what's going on in the world and in their lives. In the first year, groups in over 1,325 locations throughout the world were spinning pinwheels on September 21st - there were approximately 500,000 pinwheels spinning throughout the world. In 2008, over 2.3 million pinwheels were spinning in over 3,000 locations, including the United States, Europe, Asia, Australia, Canada, the Middle East, Africa and South America.

Joyce Janowitz, a music teacher at Cedar Hill Elementary introduced this event to the Cedar Hill students in spring of 2010 as non-political event, explaining that peace doesn't necessarily have to be associated with the conflict of war; it can be related to violence/intolerance in our daily lives, and to peace of mind. Along with Mrs. Janowitz, the staff taught the children that peace takes on a different meaning to each of us, but, in the end, it all comes down to a simple definition: "a state of calm and serenity, with no anxiety, the absence of violence, freedom from conflict or disagreement among people or groups of people."

On September 13, 2010 during Cedar Hill's team building day, "Connect with Respect", the students of Cedar Hill created their pinwheels, on one side of the pinwheel they wrote their thoughts about "war and peace/tolerance/living in harmony with others" and on the other side, they visually expressed their feelings through art. On September 21, Dianalyn Matlosz, Cedar Hill Interim School Counselor and Cathy Lundquist, Cedar Hill Kindergarten teacher, produced a peaceful march as a way for all students, staff, and parents to make a public statement and exhibit their thoughts and expressions for a peaceful and safe world. After saying the Pledge of Alliance and a few kind words from both Mrs. Matlosz and Mrs. Lundquist, all the students stood in complete silence, raised their pinwheels toward the sky and hoped the wind would blow their thoughts, feelings, and wishes for peace throughout the country and across the world.

Mrs. Matlosz and Mrs. Lundquist gave a special thanks to the staff, students, and the home and school organization because the day would not have been the success it was without the help and team effort of all those involved.





The Abut's beloved son Santi passed away in March 2008 following a very brief illness--and they, along with their two young daughters--Victoria and Caroline--felt bereft and without a place to turn. They reached out for help, and one of their primary sources of support became Judith Pedersen and Interregnum.

"We were in deep mourning after Santi's death," says Daniel, "but we knew we wanted to be able to move through this terrible trauma and learn to live again."

Which is where Interregnum and its programs came into play. "What my grief support programs do," explains Judith, "is help people learn to incorporate the memories of their loved one into their lives. We help those who have suffered a loss understand that they can move on and yet not forget their loved one--that there will always be a strong continuing bond with those they have lost."

Interregnum's Moving Forward™ bereavement support groups are led by specially trained mental health professionals who help people learn to understand and process the loss they have experienced. "What makes our bereavement support process unique," says Judith, "is that we stay connected to our clients for as long as necessary, offering different forms of support as needed. And our assistance is offered at no cost to the griever, ever, at any time."

Another of Interregnum's programs--its Hearts of Hope community outreach program, helped the Abut daughters--Victoria and Caroline. "We had so much fun," says Caroline, age 8. "We got to make hearts out of clay and then paint them pretty colors, and it made me really happy to know that those hearts were going to people who were sick or had some other sadness in their lives."

Daniel Abut claims there is nothing particularly extraordinary about him or his family. Terrible losses happen to people every day, he says, but not everyone knows there is help available. "Our family is honored to accept the 2010 Moving Forward™ Award," Daniel said. "What we want people to understand is that we could not have done it alone, and that they do not have to suffer through grief alone. Our great hope is that by helping to spread the word about Interregnum's powerful grief support programs, we can help lessen the trauma of loss for others."







## AMAZING MOLECULES!

Fifth-grade science students at Hilldale Elementary School in Pine Brook transformed into molecular chemists. As a part of the physical science curriculum in grade 5, students had the opportunity to create molecular models of common compounds. Armed with toothpicks and gumdrops, the students constructed simple molecules such as water and carbon dioxide.

Some of the more complex molecular structures made included benzene, sulfuric acid, propane, and more. Some students, using a total of 24 gumdrops, or atoms, even made a model of a molecule of glucose (sugar). "This is the best lab day yet!" was heard throughout the day, as students experienced a hands-on activity to help increase learning of a complex subject.

After the lab activity, students shared their favorite molecules. Some students thought that a molecule of water looked like "Mickey Mouse." Some students thought benzene look like the sun. Most of all, students had fun while realizing that all molecules are made up of combined atoms. All compounds are made of molecules. Some atoms, like carbon, oxygen, and hydrogen, are found in the molecules of many compounds. And even though atoms aren't gumdrops, students will always remember their molecular structure lab!




## MONTVILLE DRAGONS DEBUT

### NJ'S 911 LIFELINE LEGISLATION

This new law encourages young people to call for help in the event of an alcohol medical emergency.

Action saves lives so it must take place immediately on the scene. Unfortunately, minors faced with a medical emergency as a result of excessive drinking often hesitate to call for help, either because of uncertainty of the signs of alcohol poisoning or for fear of facing legal charges related to alcohol, possession and use.

That is why New Jersey enacted the "911 Life Line Legislation."

By no means does this legislation condone underage drinking. Rather, it responds to cases of excessive drinking by minors when medical attention is needed and creates the opportunity for their peers to save lives that are in danger due to severe intoxication. Providing immunity under these circumstances has proven to be an effective way to encourage people to call for help. If a young person is suspected of having alcohol poisoning and their friends want to help them out, they must:

- 1- Call for help- one of the underage persons call "911" and reports that another underage person is in need of medical assistance due to alcohol consumption.
- 2- Stay with your friend- the under-aged person remains on the scene with the under-aged person who is need of medical assistance; and
- 3- Talk with authorities- the under-aged person who called "911" provides each of their names to the "911" operator and cooperates with authorities on scene.

The under-aged person who is receiving medical assistance is also immune from prosecution.

## POLICE EXPLORER NEWS

The Montville Township Police Explorers Post attended the 2010 National Law Enforcement Explorer Conference in Atlanta, Georgia and took home top prizes. The National Law Enforcement Exploring Conference is conducted every other year and is attended by thousands of Law Enforcement Explorers and their adult leaders from throughout the country. They come together for a week of team and individual competition, seminars, demonstrations, exhibits, recreation and fun. This year's competition was from July 19, 2010 through July 24, 2010.

Twelve Montville Township Police Explorers and their advisors, Officer Frank Cooney, Officer Dominic Danzi and Joan Gnall, left the Montville Township Police Headquarters at 4:00 AM and drove non-stop to Atlanta in the Montville Police Explorer Van, towing the Explorers' highly customized golf cart in a special trailer. The Montville Explorers were divided into three groups; Teams A, B and C.

Team A, Brian Crownover, A.J. Herring, Pat McGrath and John Ligouri competed in Arrest and Search, Hostage Negotiation and Emergency Field First Aid. They placed in the top 10% in the country for Emergency Field First Aid.

Team B, Michael Cooney, Michael Cali, John Stretavski and Joe McCue competed in Burglary in Progress, Traffic Accident Investigation and Crime Scene Search. They placed in the top 10% in the country for Traffic Accident Investigation.

Team C, Sarah Renfer, Rosaria Riccobono, Stephen Danko and Brendan Zevitz competed in Community Service. They set up and ran a booth about community service. A second place trophy was awarded to Team C for their booth and a speech by Sarah Renfer.

The following excerpt from Sarah's speech sums up the common thread that binds our Police Explorers into a solid unit that exemplifies team spirit and cooperation.

"We have learned as Police Explorers that our visibility in the community allows our program to continue. As such, we in turn benefit from the myriad of educational programs sponsored by the Police Explorers. We are exposed to the mechanics and workings of law enforcement and the criminal justice system, learn team building and leadership, we plan, participate in and execute fundraising initiatives, and are educated in first aid and other first responder subjects. We are expected to be responsible, organized and disciplined. We sharpen our skills of observation and communication in an arena that requires us to act, when necessary, with maturity and measure. ## Curbside Recycling in Montville Township



Currently, residents alternate between placing cardboard/paper out one Wednesday and comingled bottles/cans the next Wednesday. This current system is known as dual-stream and will remain the same until March 1, 2011.

After March 1, 2011, all recyclables that are included in the Wednesday curbside collection program can be placed in one container, which will be collected every week. This system of collection is known as single stream. The items that are appropriate for inclusion in the **Wednesday, single stream, curbside collection, recycling program** are:

- Newspapers
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Plastic Bottles (with a Number 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 on the bottom, inside the recycling symbol)
- Mixed Paper
- Aluminum Cans
- Steel (Tin) cans

These recyclables should be clean of any material and placed in a rigid container not exceeding thirty five (35) gallons in capacity or fifty (50) pounds in weight.

•Vegetative Waste: If you currently receive curbside collection of Vegetative Waste (Grass Clippings, Brush, Leaves), collection will take place April through December on the first trash collection day of the week.

•White Goods/Metal Appliances: If you currently receive curbside collection of White Goods (appliances comprised predominantly of metal e.g. Refrigerators, Stoves, Washing Machines, Dryers), these items can be recycled by placing them at the curb on a specified day and scheduling a collection. When placed at the curb, they must have all doors removed and not be in the roadway.

## 5 Fun Facts About Recycling



- 1) It costs Montville Township's taxpayers over \$90 to dispose of a ton of garbage in a landfill but recycling a ton of recyclables is free. An easy way to reduce municipal expenses (SAVE TAX DOLLARS) is throw less in the garbage by recycling!
- 2) Recycling is the law in the State of New Jersey. Since 1987, disposing of mandated recyclable materials in the trash is illegal.
- 3) Not all materials that are required to be recycled are picked up through the curbside recycling program. For a list of all mandated recyclable materials and how to recycle them, check the Township's website [www.montvillenj.org](http://www.montvillenj.org).
- 4) Recycling is a community wide responsibility. According to the most up-to-date statistics available (2008), Montville Township is tied for 37<sup>th</sup> of 39 municipalities in Morris County when it comes to recycling. This means that 36 other towns are doing a better job than we are. We can easily do much better by keeping recyclables out of our trash cans!
- 5) Recycling makes sense. Recycling things rather than throwing them in the garbage is better for the environment, saves money, and will help keep our planet healthy for the future.
