BOARD OF EDUCATION ELECTION WEDNESDAY, APRIL 27 PRIMARY ELECTION TUESDAY, JUNE 7

The School Board Election, Wednesday, April 27th. Polls are open 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. Polling locations are William Mason School, Montville Township Public Library, Cedar Hill School, and the Municipal Building. Please check the sample ballot you receive in the mail for your voting location, visit www.montvillenj.org, or call 973-331-3304.

The Primary Election is Tuesday, June 7th . Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. PLEASE BE SURE TO CHECK THE SAMPLE BALLOT YOU RECEIVE IN THE MAIL FOR YOUR VOTING LOCATION.

VOTER REGISTRATION: In order to be eligible to vote in an election, you must be registered 21 days prior to the election date. Voter registration forms may be obtained from the Montville Township Municipal Building, 195 Change-bridge Road, Montville, or by contacting the Township Clerk at 973-331-3304 or tatkinson@montvillenj.org. You may also go online at www.morriselections.org and print out the form.

If you are already registered to vote but your address has changed, you must follow this procedure: If you have moved WITHIN Morris County, fill out a change in address form. If you have moved into Montville Township from a county other than Morris, you must re-register to vote by filling out a voter registration form. All forms are available at the Municipal Building or at www.morriselections.org.

VOTING BY MAIL-IN BALLOT: If you anticipate not being able to get to the polls to vote on June 7, you may vote by mail-in ballot. The deadline for the Morris County Clerk to receive absentee ballot applications by mail is seven days prior to the election. Please request your ballots early if you know you are going to be out-of-town or traveling! Once they receive your application, they will mail you an absentee ballot, which must be returned to the Morris County Clerk by mail or in person by June 7 at 8 p.m. If you have any questions regarding mail-in voting or would like to request a mail-in ballot application, please call the Township Clerk at 973-331-3304, e-mail tatkinson@montvillenj.org, or visit the Morris County Clerk's website at www.clerk.morris.nj.us to print one out.




MONTVILLE LAUNCHES THIRD ANNUAL RELAY FOR LIFE

MONTVILLE POLICE EXPLORERS TOUR THE MORRIS COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

On Wednesday February 2nd, the Montville Police Explorers along with members of the Boonton Township Police Explorer Post had an opportunity to tour the Morris County Correction Facility.

The tour was conducted by two officers from the Morris County Sheriff's Department. They took more than 30 Explorers throughout their facility educating and showing them how the county jail runs and operates on a daily basis. When sitting in a classroom at the facility one of the Explorers asked, “How many offenders are in the building?” On that particular day there were between 300-400 offenders being “housed.” The maximum capacity that the facility can hold is about 600 offenders at once. Most of the offenders that were in the building are there because of drugs. A handful were there for more serious offenses. Each offender is housed based upon size, weight, and gender, and the offense committed. There is also a separate area for the mentally unstable. They are held separately to maintain their safety as well as the safety of others. The Police Explorers toured areas such as processing. They learned how the offenders are processed which includes fingerprinting, photographing, and securing the inmates personal belongings.

The tour included seeing the actual cell blocks, areas of recreation and how prisoners get their share of fresh air and sunlight. The explorers learned about different job opportunities and how the inmates could be paid \$2-\$4 depending on their skills, whether it be in the laundry room, kitchen or even cutting hair. “It was interesting to see that the jail created jobs for the people to make money to buy things like candy, or new socks, or magazines that they could pick and choose from,” says an Explorer. Taking a tour of the Morris County Correctional Facility benefited the Explorers because they now have a better understanding of how a jail operates. This has given them yet another avenue for a career to choose from, and helps them understand that they “never want to end up on the other side of the law.”

UNDERSTANDING NEW JERSEY'S GRADUATED LICENSE PROGRAM

Following is a concise version of the N.J. Graduated License Program. To learn more visit www.njteendriving.com, and the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission for more information. After receiving your student learner's permit, you must practice supervised driving for at least six months and:

- Display a red reflective decal on each license plate (front/back); decals available at motor vehicle agencies, \$4 per pair
- No driving after 11:01 p.m. and before 5:00 a.m.
- You must be accompanied in the front seat by an adult supervising driver who is at least 21 years of age and who possesses a valid New Jersey license has a minimum of three years driving experience
- Parents, guardians or dependants are allowed as passengers. A dependant is a permit or probationary driver's child, not siblings
- Only one additional passenger is allowed unless accompanied by a parent or guardian
- You can't use cell phones, hand held video games or any other hand-free interactive, wireless communication device
- Seat belts must be worn at all times

Get a probationary license:

- You must be at least 17 years of age
- Complete the supervised driving period
- Pass the 6 Point Id verification
- Pass MVC's road test
- You must return after one year from date of issue to get a basic driver license
- Display a red reflective decal on each license plate (front/back); decals available at motor vehicle agencies, \$4 per pair
- No driving after 11:01 p.m. and before 5 a.m.
- Parents, guardians or dependents are allowed as passengers. A dependent is a permit or a probationary driver's child not siblings
- Only one additional passenger is allowed unless accompanied by a parent or guardian
- You can't use cell phones hand held video games or any other hands free interactive, wireless communications device
- Seatbelts must be worn at all times by all passengers.

RECYCLING IN MONTVILLE TOWNSHIP

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

As of March 1, 2011, the Township has entered into a new contract with Suburban Disposal Inc. for garbage and recycling collection. Within the new contract your curbside recycling collection has changed for the better. Previously, bottles/cans were separated from paper/cardboard and placed at the curb on alternating Wednesdays. Now you are able to put all of these materials in one container that will be collected every Wednesday!

Single Stream Recycling – Acceptable Materials

- Flattened cardboard •Magazines •Office Paper
- Newspapers •Brown Paper Bags •Plastics #1-#7
- Junk Mail •Phone Books
- Glass Bottles & Jars •Paperboard •Steel Cans
- Aluminum Cans, Pie Tins & Foil

Please remember to make sure all materials are rinsed clean and free of any food or debris.

Vegetative Waste (Grass Clippings, Brush, Leaves)

Vegetative waste will be collected, April through December, on your first garbage collection day of the week.

White Goods/Metal Appliances (Refrigerators, Stoves, Washing Machines, Dryers)

White goods will be collected on Wednesday following scheduling a collection with Suburban Disposal Inc. Collections can be scheduled by calling (973) 227-7020 to make an appointment. There is no additional charge for this service and please remember to remove all doors prior to placing these items at the curb (not in the roadway).

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

In addition to the change in recycling collection, Montville Township residents will now be able to recycle covered electronics (Televisions, Computers & Computer Monitors) at the Lincoln Park Recycling Center, which is located on George Cobb Lane and is open Monday-Friday from 7 AM to 3:25 PM and Saturday from 8 AM to 4:15 PM. This shared service is limited to covered electronics; please bring only televisions, computers and computer monitors to the Lincoln Park recycling center.

RECYCLING OTHER MATERIALS

In addition to those materials collected through the curbside recycling program, there are a number of materials that must be recycled and may not be thrown out in the garbage e.g. oil-contaminated soil, natural wood waste, motor oil, lead-acid batteries, hazardous dry cell batteries, whole tiles, and cover electronics. Also, there are items you may wish to recycle but are not mandated to be recycled. CURBSIDE GARbage AND RECYCLING COLLECTION CONTRACTOR CHANGE

As of March 1, 2011 the Township has a new contractor for curbside garbage and recycling collection. Suburban Disposal Inc., located in Fairfield NJ has a two year contract with the Township. It is important to note that the garbage collection schedule will not change! The collection for recycling is changing for the better – see Recycling in Montville Township for details. The new contract represents significant cost savings even though the level of service provided increases.
