Dear Montville Township residents,

After an extended and snow-filled winter, we hope you are enjoying the warm summer weather!

We are pleased to report that the volunteer Independence Day Committee has been working diligently over the past nine months to deliver yet another spectacular three-day celebration beginning on Thursday, June 25. But wait, there's more. Many of you have been asking for the return of the parade, and we are happy to tell you that Montville Township will once again have the Independence Day parade on Saturday, June 27 beginning at 1pm.

The Township Committee and Administration are pleased to report that the municipal budget, which will be adopted shortly, will have a 0.78% increase in the tax levy – the smallest increase in well over 15 years. In addition, we have allocated additional funds to expand our annual road repaving program, and the County has plans to repave a major portion of Changebridge Road this year.

The Township Committee is most excited about bringing a farmers market to the Township. On Sunday mornings starting on June 14, you will find a new Farmers Market at the Towaco Train Station parking lot on Route 202. Our market, fondly called The John Becker Farm to Table Farmers Market, Borough of Lincoln Park/Township of Montville, will be open every Sunday from 9am-2pm through October 4. The late John Becker, a Montville Township resident who was an active volunteer in town, was an advocate for a farmers market in the Township. The

market is named after Mr. Becker and will provide our residents and businesses with an alternate venue to buy fresh produce and foods direct from farmers and local vendors.

Montville Township Municipal Services

THE MUNICIPAL COURT THE FACE OF THE JUDICIARY

The Municipal Court is “The Face of the Judiciary.” For most people, the Municipal Court is their only interaction with the judicial branch of government. The Montville Township Municipal Court is a busy and important municipal service. Staffed by two full-time employees and a part-time judge, the Court handles over 6,000 matters each year, including moving violations, municipal code offenses and disorderly persons offenses. There are fish and game laws, parks and recreation ordinances, commercial vehicle safety violations, and numerous other categories in addition to parking citations, driving while intoxicated, and driving without credentials or insurance. The first duty of the Court is to treat defendants appropriately and fairly under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

In recent years, Court services and safety have been dramatically improved. With the cooperation of the Police Chief, the Courtroom security plan is complete and compliant with both state and local objectives. The use of Window First Appearances, split calendaring, and video conferencing, all implemented since 2011, have made the court day experience a shorter and less hectic adventure for those called to answer for an offense. Alternatives to payment, time-payment plans, and the use of Community Service as a supplement or alternative allows the Court to address defendants in new ways. Routine appearances by persons incarcerated in the Morris County Correction Facility are accomplished by video conference, allowing the police to remain on duty in the community instead of as monitors confined to the station.

Many people do not know that the Court is a “24/7” department. The judge and Court staff are often called upon by the police in the middle of the night or during weekends and holidays. These calls are to consider the grant of a restraining order, or to find probable cause for arrest or complaint, and to set bail for those arrested so that they have an opportunity to avoid incarceration. The Monday afternoon session of the Court is not the only time that it is convened. Most trials are scheduled after the session or on a different day altogether, as a “special session.” This is required because trials generally consume too much time to integrate into the typical calendar. It would be unfair to expect dozens of people waiting for their matter to be addressed to sit and observe an hour or two long trial involving another party.

The service to the community in enforcing public safety and compliance with laws and ordinances may be the primary task, but the Court also provides educational services, access to various benefit programs, and even the officiating of marriage ceremonies for local residents. There is much more to the Municipal Court than a place to pay your speeding ticket! All proceedings are public and transparent. The general public is invited to observe their government in action.

MONTVILLE TOWNSHIP SENIOR HOUSE NEWS

The Montville Senior House, located at 356 Main Road in Montville, is open daily to all Township residents age 55 and older, and offers a wide variety of classes, activities and special events. With age-appropriate exercise classes ranging from Senior Aerobics and Yoga, to Tai Chi and Line Dancing, there is something for everyone. Residents are encouraged to join a game of Pokeno, Mahjong or Mexican Train, or get involved with our thriving Senior Citizen Club. Throughout the year the Senior House hosts medical and social services presentations, as well as health screenings and programs designed especially for our senior population.

This summer, in addition to our regular classes and activity schedule, we will be hosting many special events and programs. In May we kicked off the season with our annual Wildwood Trip and the fun continues throughout the summer. Join us for our spring/summer Birthday Breakfast on June 12, or our Senior Ice Cream Social on June 26. The Senior Club is sponsoring a four-day/three-night trip to Virginia Beach in September, and we are already planning our annual Senior Picnic and Fishing Derby for early fall. Each month new programs are designed to meet the specific needs of our seniors, and trips and social events are open to all interested parties. The Senior House is also home to our thriving Senior Citizen Club. The Senior Club initial yearly membership is \$20 per person and meetings are held the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month. The Club sponsors their own trips and special events throughout the year and the meetings provide much needed information and programming for our membership. In addition to our regular programming, the Senior House hosts the Morris County Nutrition Program's Senior Lunch and Bingo every Tuesday and Thursday. This program offers a fun and casual social atmosphere as well as a catered hot lunch to all attending for a suggested donation of \$2.00. Montville Township has Adopted Single Stream Recycling

As part of the Single Stream Recycling Collection Program, all recyclable material can be placed unsorted in the same recycling container for curbside pickup. Cans, bottles, and recyclable plastics are collected together with paper and cardboard. Please empty and rinse items prior to disposal. **PLEASE NOTE: The Township of Montville cannot pick up recyclables that are placed in plastic bags. Items in plastic bags will be left at the curb.**

ACCEPTABLE RECYCLABLE MATERIALS include:

- **Mixed Paper**
 - Newspapers/Magazines/Catalogs
 - Junk Mail/Envelopes/Flyers
 - Paperbacks/Phone Books
 - Office, Scrap or Computer Paper
 - Wrapping Paper/Paper Bags
- **Cardboard**
 - Flattened Boxes/Corrugated Cardboard
 - Cereal/Cookie/Soda or Beer Boxes/Paper Egg Cartons/Shoe Boxes
 - Pasta/Frozen Food/Cookie
 - Tissue Boxes/Paper Towel or Toilet Paper
 - Cardboard Rolls
- **Plastic Containers or Grades of #1, #2 or #5 Only**
 - Water or Soft Drink Bottles/Milk Jugs (if you drink out of it, then recycle it)
 - Yogurt or Margarine Containers/Cooking Oil or Salad Dressing Bottles/Aspirin Containers
 - Detergent or Shampoo Bottles (small neck containers)
- **Glass Bottles and Jars**
 - Glass Containers of all colors
 - Bottles and Food Jars (must be clean)
- **Metal Cans**
 - Aluminum Cans (Soda, Beer)/ Aluminum Foil (must be clean)
 - Tin/Steel Cans (Soup, Fruit, Tuna)
 - Pet Food Cans (must be clean)/ Coffee Cans

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS include:

- Plastics of Grades #3, #4, #6 or #7, or no number on container
- All Plastic Bags (shopping bags/garbage bags/Ziploc bags/frozen food bags)
- Plastic Film (wrap/garment bags)
- Styrofoam of any kind (coffee cups/clamshell food containers/packaging peanuts)
- Frozen microwave trays or food platters/plastic food containers even if Grade #1, #2 or #5
- Disposable utensils/Plastic plates or cups
- Wax coated paper cartons or boxes (milk, juice, ice cream or soup cartons)
- Rigid plastics such as toys, crates, and lawn furniture
- Hoses/electrical cords/appliances/scrap metal/tarps/ pool covers
- Pesticide, oil or antifreeze containers (if empty, place in regular garbage)
- Hard covers on books must be removed before recycling
- Shredded paper

- **Vegetative Waste** (Grass Clippings, Brush, Leaves, etc.): First garbage pickup day of the week (Mondays or Tuesdays), April through December

Montville Township will celebrate our nation's independence on June 25 – 27, 2015. The celebration will include carnival rides, music, entertainment, food and will conclude with a spectacular fireworks demonstration on Saturday, June 27, 2015. The celebration will be attended by many and will cause traffic delays throughout the three-day period. Residents and travelers in the area of Horseneck Road by the Montville High School and Montville Library should expect heavier than normal traffic and altered traffic patterns. The following areas will see an increase in traffic:

Thursday 6/25/15: Horseneck Road, Changebridge Road beginning around 6pm in the areas of the High School and the Community Center.




HOW DOES URBANIZATION CHANGE A WATERSHED?

Urbanization (or development) has a great effect on local water resources. It changes how water flows in the watershed and what flows in the water. Both surface and ground water flow are changed.

As a watershed becomes developed, trees, shrubs and other plants are replaced with impervious surfaces (roads, rooftops, parking lots and other hard surfaces that do not allow stormwater to soak into the ground). Without the plants to store and slow the flow of stormwater, the rate of stormwater runoff is increased. Less stormwater is able to soak into the ground because sidewalks, roads, parking lots and rooftops block this infiltration. This means a greater volume of water reaches the waterway faster and less of that water is able to infiltrate to ground water. This in turn leads to more flooding after storms but reduced flow in streams and rivers during dry periods. The reduced amount of infiltrating water can lower ground water levels, which in turn can stress local waterways that depend on steadier flows of water.





In the stream, more erosion of stream banks and scouring of channels will occur due to volume increase. This in turn degrades habitat for plant and animal life that depend on clear water. Sediment from eroded stream banks clogs the gills of fish and blocks light needed for plants. The sediment settles to fill in stream channels, lakes and reservoirs. This also increases flooding and the need for dredging to clear streams or lakes for boating.

In addition to the high flows caused by urbanization, the increased runoff also contains increased contaminants. These include litter, cigarette butts and other debris from sidewalks and streets, motor oil poured into storm sewers, heavy metals from brake linings, settled air pollutants from car exhaust and pesticides and fertilizers from lawn care. These contaminants reach local waterways quickly after a storm.



STORMWATER SEWER BASICS



Stormwater flows into the stormwater system through a storm drain. These are frequently located along the curbs of parking lots and roadways. The grate that prevents larger objects from flowing into the storm sewer system is called a catch basin. Once below ground, the stormwater flows through pipes which lead to an outfall where the stormwater enters a stream, river or lake. In most areas of New Jersey, the stormwater sewer goes directly to local waterway without any treatment.

In some areas of the state, the outfall may lead to a stormwater management basin. These basins control the flow of stormwater and can also improve water quality, depending on how they are designed. These basins are frequently seen in newer commercial and residential areas.

In some older urban areas of the state, the stormwater and sanitary sewer systems may be combined. Here both stormwater and sewage from households and businesses travel together in the same pipes. Both stormwater and sewage are treated at sewage treatment plants except during heavy rains. During these occasions, both the stormwater and untreated sewage exceed the capacity of the treatment plant and this overflow is directed into local waterways.

PROTECTING STORMWATER SEWERS

In the first rush of water from a rainstorm, much of the debris and other pollutants that had settled on the land surface and in the stormwater sewer since the last storm will be picked up and carried into the local stream. This can significantly add to water quality problems. It is therefore important to protect the stormwater system from sources of pollution.

The following should never be dumped down storm drains, road gutters or catch basins: motor oil, pet waste, grass trimmings, leaves, debris and hazardous chemicals of any kind. Anything dumped in our stormwater collection systems will be carried into our streams.

CONTROLLING STORMWATER FLOW

Managing stormwater to reduce the impact of development on local watersheds and aquifers relies on minimizing the disruption in the natural flow - both quality and quantity of stormwater. By designing with nature, the impact of urbanization can be greatly reduced.

This can be accomplished by following these principles:

- minimizing impervious surfaces;
- maximizing natural areas or areas of dense vegetation;
- structural stormwater controls such as stormwater management basins; and
- practicing pollution prevention by avoiding contact between stormwater and pollutants.

Managing stormwater in your own backyard is important. As an integral part of the watershed you live in, what you do in your backyard makes a difference. Here are some examples of what you can do at home:

YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN YOUR OWN BACKYARD

- 1 Reduce impervious surfaces by using pavers or bricks rather than concrete for a driveway or sidewalk.
- 2 Divert rain from paved surfaces onto grass to permit gradual infiltration.
- 3 Landscape with the environment in mind. Choose the appropriate plants, shrubs and trees for the soil in your yard; don't select plants that need lots of watering (which increases surface runoff), fertilizers or pesticides.
- 4 Maintain your car properly so that motor oil, brake linings, exhaust and other fluids don't contribute to water pollution.
- 5 Keep stormwater clean. Never dump litter, motor oil, animal waste, or leaves into storm drains or catch basins.
