Please join in celebrating our freedoms by coming out to our Independence Day parade, festivities and fireworks. Our July 4th committee has worked tirelessly to provide a fun-filled weekend for you and your family. All the activities are listed within this Messenger.

With the downturn in the economy, we've recognized the need to focus ever more on fiscal responsibility. In doing so, Montville recently enjoyed several bits of good news on the financial front –

- In spite of reduced state aid and significant increases in pension costs, our Township Administrator, department heads and employees delivered a budget with a 4.9% increase in our municipal tax rate, the lowest increase in 10 years!

- We have reduced our Municipal debt by over 10% in the last 2 years!

- We continue to follow the recommendations of our Long Term Financial Planning Committee, including self-imposed limits on capital spending.

- All of the above was recognized by the Standard & Poor independent ratings agency when they graded our recent bond offering their highest AAA rating! Only 7 of the 566 towns in New Jersey have attained that recognition!

Please mark September 14th on your calendar – that is the date of our annual Montville Day celebration, another fun day for children and adults.

The Montville Township Environmental Commission has an open position. If you are interested in becoming a member, please contact the Township Clerk at 973-331-3304 or tatkinson@montvillenj.org.

Functions of the Environmental Commission: Conducts reviews on the use and possible use of the open land areas of the Township of Montville. The Commission may advertise, prepare, print and distribute books, maps, charts, plans and pamphlets relating to its function. It maintains an index of all open areas, publicly or privately owned, including open marshlands, swamps and other wetlands, in order to obtain information on the proper use of such areas. From time to time, it recommends to the Montville Township Planning Board or the Township Committee, plans and programs for inclusion in the Township of Montville Master Plan and the development and use of such areas. The Commission also studies and makes recommendations concerning open space preservation, water resources management, air pollution control, solid waste management, noise control, soil and landscape protection, environmental appearance, marine resources and protection of flora and fauna. The Environmental Commission is also involved in the development review process and may submit a report to the Planning Board. A report from the Environmental Commission is required wherever an application includes an environmental impact statement.

Most recently, the Environmental Commission co-sponsored the very successful Township's Tree City/Arbor Day Program and the Electronics Recycling Program.

CAT LICENSES DUE

June is the renewal month for cat licenses. All cat licenses expire at the end of June 2008 and are subject to renewal during the month of June. License forms will be mailed to homes of previously licensed cats in early June and should be checked for accuracy, changed where necessary and returned to the health department with the appropriate fee and proof of current rabies vaccination and spay/neuter certification, if not correctly indicated on the form. If a cat owner does not receive a renewal form or if additional applications are needed, blank forms are available at the health department or off the Township website (www.montvillenj.org) under Municipal Services/Forms. Late fees take effect July 1.

Rabies expiration dates that expire before April 1, 2009 will require new immunizations prior to licensing. Should you have any questions on the Montville cat licensing program, please contact the health department at 973-331-3316.

THE CHELSEA CELEBRATES 20TH ANNIVERSARY

The senior residence known since 2000 as The Chelsea at Montville recently marked its 20th anniversary serving the senior community of Montville and surrounding areas.

When the residence opened its doors in 1988, it was known as The Changebridge Inn and represented a new concept in senior living. At the time, seniors essentially had two choices: continue to live at home or move into a nursing home. For many people, neither of these options was acceptable.

The Changebridge Inn was created to provide a middle ground, a place where seniors could live and remain active, receive some assistance with difficult tasks, and not have to worry about caring for a home and being alone.

In 2000, The Chelsea (www.chelseaseniorliving.com) took over management of the community. Today, there are 140 residents, most living in studio or one-bedroom apartments. In addition, The Chelsea at Montville's Country Cottage provides a safe and supportive environment for residents with Alzheimer's and other memory impairments.

Residents at The Chelsea participate in a variety of on- and off-site activities.

On-site activities include clubs and classes such as quilting, cooking and gardening, and events such as an actor's studio and casino nights. Of course, residents can get together and do whatever they enjoy, including playing cards, walking the well-manicured grounds, watching television and more.

For off-site activities, residents can use their own cars or The Chelsea's bus, which takes them to restaurants, shopping malls, theaters, museums, medical appointments and other locations.

Residents also are active in township activities, with many serving as volunteers at schools, houses of worship and local organizations.

"This is an active, vibrant community," said Kevin Seidel, executive director of The Chelsea. "The founders of The Changebridge Inn were visionaries 20 years ago, and we are proud to be continuing that tradition as we serve the changing needs of today's seniors."

Recreation & Pathways Present "Summer Magic on Safari!"

Pathways for Exceptional Children wrote a grant on behalf of the Montville Township Recreation Department called the Recreational Opportunities for Individuals with Disabilities, or the ROID, grant. As a result, Montville Township was awarded \$10,000 from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, giving us the resources to expand our highly successful Magic of Reading program to include a summer camp for 2008. This camp, called Summer Magic on Safari, is open to all children ages 4-10.

This is not like any other camp—it boasts daily reading instruction in the "magic" style, emphasizing the basic reading strategies, providing confidence and success by working from knowledge to new learning. Our summer camp will have three teachers, two certified teaching assistants, three camp counselors and many mentors to enhance the small group instruction and attention, enabling each child to be enormously successful. The program will be limited to 25 children. Campers must sign up for all four weeks.

This program offers an exciting, thematic approach. Weekly themes will be loosely based on a 'safari' concept, with each week and theme culminating in a special trip to a related venue, allowing the concepts and vocabulary to be ingrained in each child's memory. Each day at camp will include:

- A quality piece of children's literature as a common element of all activities
- A science lesson emphasizing the text and pictures
- A social studies/geography project—Where do the animals live?
- A language activity involving the vocabulary in the book
- An arts and crafts activity
- Reading class (keeping the magic alive)

The camp will run four days a week for four consecutive weeks. Mondays through Wednesdays, the camp will be held at the Montville Township Public Library Pio Costa Auditorium from 9:30am-12:00pm. On Thursdays, the children will take a field trip by bus to different, exciting places. The trips will run from approximately 9:00 am-2:00 pm. Each week a different "Safari" topic will be covered. The 2008 schedule is as follows:

Week 1 – June 30-July 3: Friendly Bugs (Field Trip to IMAX – BUGS 3D)

Week 2 – July 7-10: Under the Sea (Field Trip to Jenkinson's Aquarium in Point Pleasant, NJ)

Week 3 – July 14-17: Who Hides in the Rainforest? (Field Trip to Bronx Zoo: Jungleworld and Rainforest area)

Week 4 – July 21-24: Animal Friends (Field Trip to Turtle Back Zoo; the children will travel by bus. Their families are welcome to meet us there for a picnic on the last day)

Registration: Camp costs \$150 per week plus \$33, which includes all entry fees for field trips. To register, pay \$633.00 to Montville Township Recreation. MTHS ROBOTICS TEAM WINS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Students from Montville Township High School competed April 17-18th at the FIRST Tech Challenge World Championship. The competition was held in Atlanta, GA at the Georgia Dome. The students competed against the top one hundred teams drawn from more than eight hundred competitors from as far away as Singapore. The students' robot, which could be run autonomously or by driver control, competed in this year's game Quad Quandary which involved stacking 3 inch PVC rings on goal posts and taking control of scoring platforms. After two fierce days of competition, Team 30 from Montville Twp., Captain of a three team alliance, won the FIRST Tech Challenge World Championship Competition on April 18th.

The FIRST Tech Challenge is one of two high school level competitions hosted by FIRST Robotics (usfirst.org). FIRST, which stands for "For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology," has programs for elementary to high school aged students. The aim of all of the competitions is to show students how exciting Math, Science, and Engineering can be and inspire them to pursue an education and become Science and technology leaders. Founded by Dean Kamen, inventor of the Segway, FIRST is a unique sport which has been described as, "the only sport where every participant can become a professional" - Mike Turner, CEO BAE Systems. FIRST programs globally touch more than 150,000 students each year. The energy and intensity of students involved with the program has surprised even former presidents. During the opening ceremonies at this year's competition, while giving a speech on the importance of FIRST, President George H.W. Bush paused to look at the colorful crowd of roughly 20,000 students and mentors representing teams from all of FIRST's Programs in the Georgia Dome and said, "This is like the WWF...for smart people."

The Robotics Club won the Inspire Award in New York City. The Inspire Award is the highest honor awarded at a Regional and is given to the team a panel of judges find best embodied the core objectives of the FTC program. At the World Championship the FTC team finished 2nd in its division's qualifying matches. Prior to the start of quarter finals the top 8 teams in each division choose two alliance partners to compete alongside them. Montville's Team 30 "Mr. T" had the privilege of inviting Team 74 "Team Overdrive" from Bridgewater, NJ and Team 23 "Beach Cities Robotics" from Torrance, California to their alliance.

These teams together went on to first win the Edison Division and then beat Franklin Division's winning alliance to become World Champions. In Atlanta the FTC Team was led by student Tom Hoffmann on and off the field. The robot was expertly driven by Chris Gettel and the scoring boom was operated by David Plishka. The robot's autonomous and driver code was written by Alex Crane, Megan Sattur and Michael Propper under the mentorship of FRC programmer Elliot Crane. The robot was maintained by Jeffrey Himelson and Tae Seo Park under the direction of FRC mechanic Steve Reynolds. Team marketing was directed by Chelsea Dorenbush and Jenna Zeringo. FRC team members Paul Cimino, Tom Connolly, and Kevin Crump provided logistical and team scouting support

under the direction of FRC team captain Christopher Preciado. Adam Berger and Alex Bemstein though not in attendance in Atlanta made invaluable contributions to the team's success.

The students were coached by Bill Giraud and Gary Frankel, Science teachers at Montville Township High School. Additional support was provided by college mentor Noah Melamed, a student at New Jersey Institute of Technology. The Plishka & Connolly Families were also on hand at the Championship to provide support. The Robotics Programs in Montville Township High School are generously supported by the Montville Township Board of Education, Marotta Controls Inc., Servo Systems Inc., The Montville Education Foundation and numerous other business and individuals from Northern NJ. 
MTHS STAGE

MONTVILLE RECYCLES ELECTRONICS

On a wonderful Saturday morning April 26th, Members of the Montville Key Club, Montville Environmental Commission and Montville Women's Club gathered together for what is becoming an annual GREEN event. The event was held for the collection of old and used computers and electronics.

Urban Renewal Corp., a charitable company from Newark, assisted the group of eager participants in gathering up computers, printers, monitors, keyboards, cell phones and radios. The line of cars formed in the parking lot of the municipal building at 8:30am and continued throughout the day. Two large 20 foot trucks were on hand to collect the hundreds of donations of computers and electronics.

The event was a great success in part from the generous Montville residents and many Key club members that attended. The event was organized so that residents would just have to pull their cars up to the service area. Key club members assisted in carrying the items to waiting pallets. Residents were given a receipt for their donation. It was as easy as could be.

The entire project ran with NO COST to Montville Township or residents who donated electronics. Electronic items cannot be placed in regular trash pick up and bringing the items to some recycling centers can cost residents to have it taken away.

Urban Renewal takes the items to their warehouse in Newark. The items are sorted, cleaned and refurbished. Computers are either used in their training facility or sold. Proceeds help run Urban Renewal's entire program, which brings homeless and less fortunate into their facility. They are taught working skills, given a place to live, food to eat, and clothing. Within a period of time these folks can go out on their own with usable, valuable job skills. It is a win-win situation for everyone involved. It fosters self esteem, self sufficiency and a new life for many of the participants at the Urban Renewal facility. It is a GREEN project that helps the community in many ways.

Silver Award Project -- Troop 1868

Montville Girl Scout Troop 1868 just completed the requirements for their Silver Award. The twelve eighth grade girls collected donations of coloring books, crayons, markers and small toys from all five elementary schools in Montville. The girls also received fabric donations from Girl Scout families in Montville. They used the donated fabric to sew drawstring bags to hold the toys. The girls also raised money through sponsoring Brownie and Junior Girl Scout activities and through selling Girl Scout cookies. They used the money to buy additional books and toys to fill more gift bags. All in all, the girls made about 300 bags, distributing them to four hospitals -- St. Joseph's Children's Hospital, Chilton Memorial, Morristown Memorial and Saint Clare's.

In order to earn their Girl Scout Silver Award, a girl scout must earn four interest patches (each one taking from 3 to 8 hours to earn), they must spend at least 15 hours in a leadership role, and must spend at least 40 hours working on the Silver Award project. In total, the Silver Award is the culmination of about 75 hours of time. Troop 1868 took two years to complete the award requirements.

Caren Bianco, the troop's leader, said, "With 12 girls in the troop, 40 hours per girl amounts to 480 girl-hours. Some of the girls have spent upwards of 50 hours working on the Silver Award project. They began in November, when they approached Dr. Bowen, the Montville Superintendent of Schools, to ask permission to do the collections. The work really picked up from February through April, when the girls collected items from the schools, sewed the bags, designed "get well" bracelets for the bags, filled out personalized tags for each bag and raised money to fill even more. I am very proud of how the girls have enthusiastically taken on each task. I really think that they had fun doing this project."



Lt. David J. Peterson and Ptl. Dominick Danzi of the traffic division are excited to assist Montville Township residents with the installation of their child safety seats.



WHO OWNS THE SIDEWALKS?

The question is often asked as to who owns the sidewalks? The answer is simple, but yet complicated as well. Sidewalks that run parallel to a public road, located within the road Right-of-Way are considered a municipal improvement. The road right-of-way is the property on which the road is located, but is wider than the road itself, either curb to curb, or edge to edge. Roads that measure 30' curb-to-curb are typical located within a right-of-way that is 50' wide, leaving 10' of property on each side beyond the curb and pavement. The Township owns this property within the right-of-way, beyond the pavement, or the Township has deeded rights for public use. Under Chapter 12 of the Montville Township Municipal Code, each property owner is required to maintain the right-of-way property between their property line and the edge of the road or curb. This requirement pertains to corner lots as well.

Similarly, the rights-of-way of County Roads are properties that are owned by the County or the County has deeded rights for public use. Maintenance requirements of the right-of-way property imposed in Chapter 12 pertain to County Road rights-of-way as well. The County Roads within Montville Township are Boonton Avenue, Changebridge Road, Jacksonville Road, Main Road (Route 202), and Whitehall Road.

The maintenance requirements of Chapter 12 also pertain to sidewalks located within the road right-of-way, either Township or County. The Code requires that the adjacent property owner keep the sidewalk in good condition, making repairs or replacement as needed. Sidewalk maintenance under the Code also includes removal of snow and ice within 24 hours from the end of the storm and trimming of overhanging branches or bushes that restrict the use of the sidewalk. Sidewalk repairs or replacement requires a permit issued by the Township Engineering Department. All property owners are encouraged to contact the Engineering Department at 973-331-3323 with all questions pertaining to sidewalk maintenance.

PSE&G – NEW, MORE AGGRESSIVE STANDARDS FOR ROW MANAGEMENT

PSE&G is in the process of cutting trees for REQUIRED maintenance of their Transmission Line Right-of-Way (ROW) through Montville Township. In 2008, PSE&G is working on eleven spans. They will be working on additional spans in Montville Township in future years. The REQUIRED maintenance, in accordance with revised New Jersey Board of Public Utility's (BPU) vegetation management regulations, is much more AGGRESSIVE than what our residents have become accustomed to. The Township has attempted to intercede on the behalf of residents that have already been impacted by the new regulations; however, we have encountered the problem that this is maintenance that is REQUIRED by State of NJ regulation. The purpose of this notice is two-fold. One is to get the word out to affected residents. The second is to give residents an opportunity to voice their concerns to the property authority. The BPU will be establishing a method to officially comment on the BPU website. When the comment section of the BPU website becomes available, sometime in June, the link will be posted on the Township's website.

POLICE DEPARTMENT WARNS ABOUT THE NEWEST EMAIL SCAM: "THE HIT-MAN"

Imagine opening your email in box and reading a message from an alleged assassin- claiming you're the target. The email claims that a hit-man has been paid \$50,000 to "terminate" you. However, he will cancel the contract on your life if you pay a large sum of money. The message states that a "friend" ordered the hit, but after following you for over a week, the assassin is now convinced that you are innocent and is therefore willing to let you live in exchange for a substantial payout. The FBI cautions that recipients should not respond, as doing so just sends a signal to senders that they've reached a live account, which escalates the intimidation. The scammers hope that the fear is so great that it will be enough to convince the victim to pay up.

The hit-man e-mails often include personal information- one such email even included the daughter's full name. As frightening as this might seem, such personal details are easy to obtain.

These scam e-mails are generally sent to a large number of people within a targeted group in the hope that one or more will respond and be drawn further into the scam. Remember, providing any personal information in response to an unsolicited email can compromise your identity and open your to identity theft.

Township Revising Credit Card Policy

The Township is in the process of changing its credit card policy. Residents will still have the ability to use their credit cards for payment of taxes and other fees, however, the Township will no longer be paying the service fee charged by the credit card company. The reason for the new policy is two-fold;

- 1) The credit card fees are having an adverse impact on municipal revenues, especially in light of the present low interest rates.
- 2) There is an inequity in that a small percentage of taxpayers are using credit cards; which is costing all taxpayers in the loss of Township revenues.




